FABRICS

For this quilt, we're going to use 1930's reproduction prints, only using the ones that have a strong contrast with our light, which will be unbleached muslin purchased by the guild. Mary Ann may call on some of you to help with the cutting of the muslin.

For the entire quilt we will need about 600 assorted 2 ½" squares cut from a wide variety of different 1930's reproduction fabrics.

If you have 1930's fabrics and would like to share some of it, please cut into 2 ½" squares at home and bring to the workshop. Please measure carefully to ensure the ease in construction. Our goal is to completely finish the quilt top that day.

SUPPLIES:

2 ½" squares as listed above. You do not need to bring the entire 600 squares yourself; but, if each participant could bring as many as they can, it would be helpful

Sewing machine, cord and foot pedal, extension cord and machine manual

Cutting mat, rotary cutter, and ruler

Muslin colored thread, no light gray, please

Scissors, seam ripper, and other sewing supplies

Sharp pencil, a mechanical pencil works well for this step

Iron and pad (every 4th person)

Lunch or arrangements to order locally
