



## Poppins Bag Materials List

This is a very large zipper top bag that really holds its shape because of the metal stays inserted into the top binding. Although it's a challenging bag to make, it is well worth the extra effort because it is so functional and beautiful.

Pattern: Poppins Bag by Aunties Two #AT617

Other sized Poppins bags are also available.

### Fabric:

<b>Fabric A- (Focus Fabric) Outside Bag Body and Pockets</b>	<b>1 yard</b>
<b>Fabric B- Inside Bag Body and Pockets</b>	<b>1 yard</b>
<b>Pocket lining, bottom and handles</b>	<b>1 yard</b>
<b>Fabric C- Binding, sashing, zipper bows and tabs</b>	<b>½ yard</b>

Another option is to use 2 ½ inch strips for the inside and outside of the bag (26 strips). If you use strips for your bag, you will need an extra 3/8 yard for pockets as well as 1 yard for the pocket lining, bottom and handles. You will also need Fabric C requirements for the binding, sashing, zipper bows and tabs ( ½ yard).

### Interfacing:

**Bag Body- Bosal's IN-R-FORM PLUS (58" wide)**

**1 yard Bag Bottom- Stiff double-sided fusible interfacing (20" wide)**

**Bosal's CRAF-TEX PLUS or Pellon's 72F** **¾ yard**

**OR**

**Pre-cut CRAF-TEX PLUS Camden Bag Bottom**

**Stays: 2 metal stays are included with most patterns. They can also be purchased separately.**

**Handles : ¼ " (outside diameter) plumbing tubing (optional)**

**Zipper: 30" handbag zipper with double sides by Annies**

**Standard Sewing Supplies**

**Matching thread**

**Sewing machine with a walking foot(helpful) with attached table (also helpful)**

**Iron, parchment paper or Teflon sheet**

**Removable marker or chalk**

**Scrap paper & pins to label the cut pieces**
